6. School Readiness Liaison Report

- Office of Early Childhood (OEC) Updates
 - Bristol Child Development Center (BCDC) was approved for their space change retroactive to July 1, 2022 moving one slot from West St to Burlington Ave
 - OEC went back to reimbursing programs by children's attendance July 1. Imagine Nation, A Museum Early Learning Center (INMELC) was full in July at 119, and BCDC had 118/124 enrolled. BOE starts with September report.
 - COLA for 2021-2022 came in mid-June. City held special meeting so we could get checks to programs before June 30th to be in compliance (BCDC - \$40,689; INMELC - \$39,048)
 - COLA for 2022-2023: BCDC \$96,637; INMELC \$92,740
 - Infant/toddler reimbursement rate increasing to \$13,500 and State creating 1,300 new spaces
 - OEC requiring FD/FY programs to be open 48 weeks rather than 50 weeks, and community programs planning to close two afternoons for PD – the Fridays before Columbus and Presidents' Days.
 - OEC updating parent fee structure to reflect rising medium income and % of income rather than flat rate. It just came out and will go into effect October 1 after trainings.
 BCDC discussing plan to increase rates slightly and will re-determine families in October.
 - New COVID guidelines for early childhood programs and schools
- Local Updates
 - Received grant from Main Street Community Foundation for mini-amplifiers, which were distributed last week
 - Plan to hold September, October, May and June meetings in person
 - Workforce issues programs struggling to hire and retain staff. Meeting with Mayor, Dawn Nielsen, Justin Malley, Cindy Bombard, Donna K, Manny Martinez and Maegan Adams to discuss options to promote profession.
 - Council needs to approve Alternate Care Policy for full-day/full-year programs for families to be able to access care should their program close. *Motion by School Readiness Council member Andrew Howe and seconded by Amber Lipscomb, it was a unanimous vote to: Approve the Alternate Care Policy as presented.*
